- Northamptonshire
- Buckinghamshire
- Somerset
- Hampshire
- Bucks Aldermans represent 40% of all Aldermans in the UK

Bucks Aldermans

- 2 branches of Bucks Aldermans
 - William Alderman of Great Horwood died 1709
 - Children born in Great Horwood from 1634
 - Beachampton
 - Dadford
 - Swanbourne
 - Winslow
 - Richard Alderman of Whitchurch died 1729
 - Whitchurch
 - Tring
 - Haddenham
- Probably 2 brothers who originated from Northamptonshire

TERRY ALDERMAN


AUSTRALIA have recalled veteran seamer Terry Alderman after suffering another crushing Test defeat against the West Indies.

Alderman, who has just finished a three-year ban for playing in South Africa, has been chosen for the 13-man squad for the one-day series against the West Indies and Pakistan which begins on Saturday.



AUSTRALIA – First innings 395-8 (Wood 111, Waugh 81, Boon 81).	

404-run target on the final day, never recovered after losing their first three wickets for only 46 runs. The four-pronged West Indian pace attack exploited the ever-widening cracks on the pitch to claim eight of the nine wickets.

The chief resistance came from first innings century-maker Graeme Wood (42) and wicket-keeper Ian Healy, who hit a maiden Test half-century.

Where did Richard come from?

- Alderman family of Adstock:
 - Richard Alderman baptised 1751
- his wife Ann Green came from Hoggeston

Thomas Alderman

- 5th child of Richard Alderman
- Born 1782 son of Richard & Ann Alderman
 - Horse driver of Swanbourne
 - 1805 married Hannah Phillips
 - caught for sheep stealing
- Transported for 7 years
 - arrived Sydney 1817
 - Servant
 - 1822 freed of servitude
 - Died 1863 in Sydney

Emigrating to Australia 1850s

- Charles & Mary Alderman
 - With sons
 - 1854 sailed on the Samuel Boddington, NSW
- & his cousin:
- William & Anne Alderman
 - With sons Alfred & Edmund
 - 1856 sailed on the Sultana, New South Wales

Joseph Alderman


- Born 1843
- 8th child of Charles & Hannah Alderman
- Staunch Primitive Methodist
- 1868 married Louisa Claridge
 - Worked as tailor in Marylebone
- 1871 set up as tailor in Swanbourne
- 1873 Secretary of Swanbourne Strike Committee
 - 6 Aldermans on the committee


Peterborough connection

- 1874 set up as tailor in Widnes, Lancashire
